In it, Paul also addressed the problems of the teachings of the Judaizers and those of the antinomian libertines. 1st and 2nd Peter— The Apostle Peter wrote these two letters from his prison cell in Rome to Gentile Christians scattered throughout the world of that time. Those Christians were facing persecution from the outsiders of the Christian faith much as Christians do today from a pagan and hostile society. Peter’s advice to them was to live above the ways of the world and to even rejoice when they were persecuted because our sovereign God is in control and He is working everything out for the good of His children. Peter advised the readers of these letters to keep in mind all that God has prepared for them to enjoy for all eternity. Peter spent the last 10 years of his life in Rome in prison and was martyred there about 67 AD.

Please join us in our verse by verse study of these powerful letters from Peter. Our class is very interactive with many questions and much discussion. Our goal is to know our God better as we see Him through the eyes of Peter. (Dick Pitzer) Class Room A
